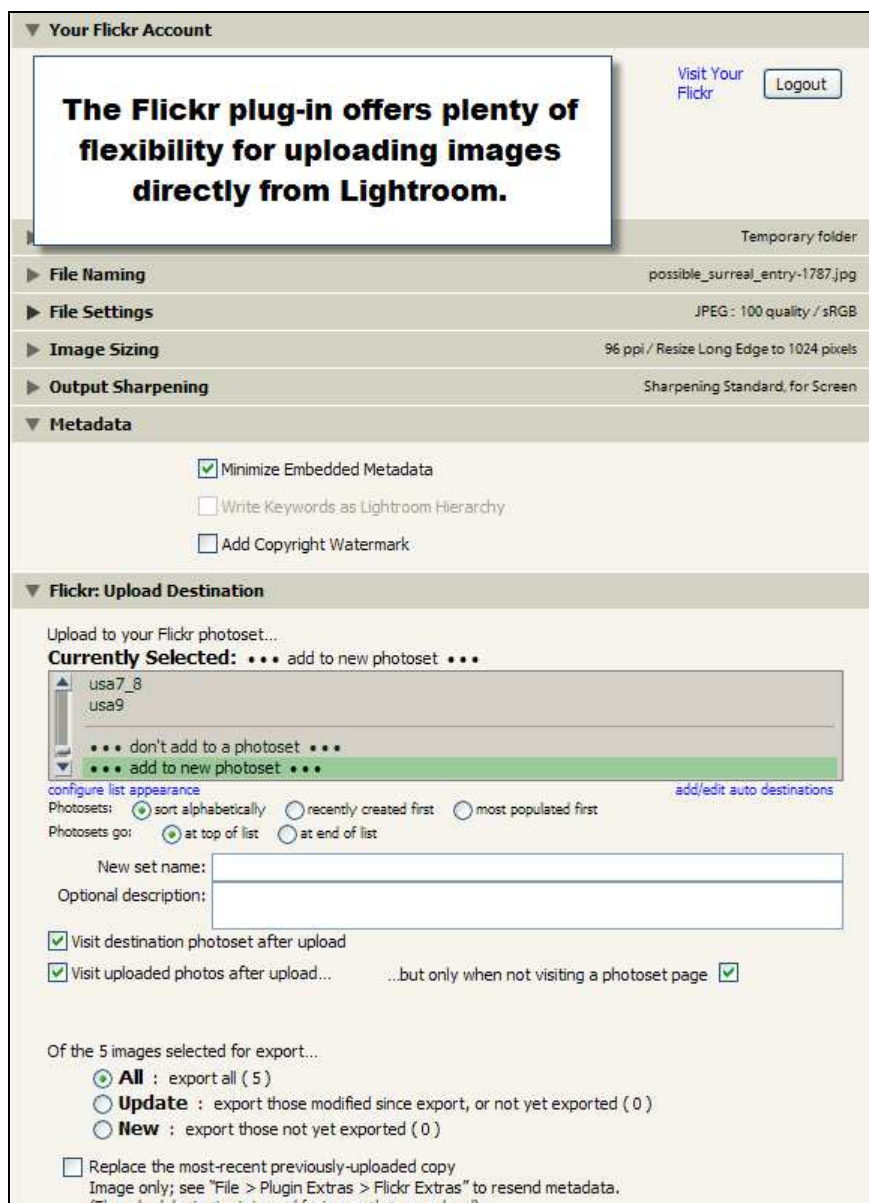
If you use Lightroom, it is possible to directly upload images to Flickr – all you need is a plug-in that is available here:

This is “donation ware” – i.e. practically free and there’s plenty of help on the author, Jeremy Friedl’s website as to how to install the plug-in.


