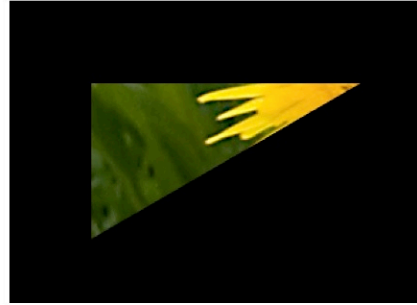
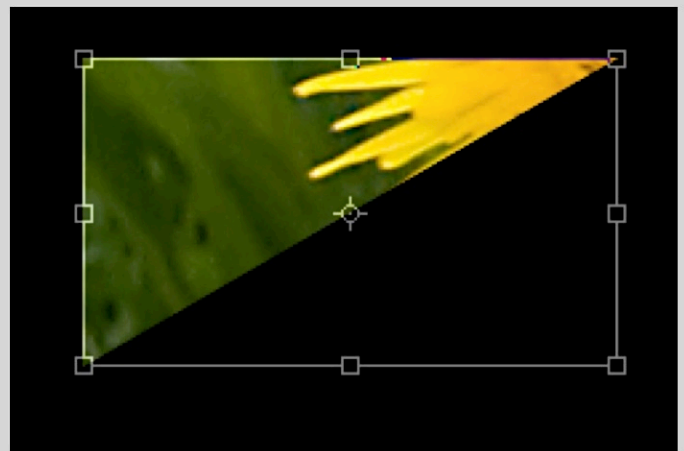


## Making Patterns in Photoshop - Part 3

Open up any original image or the same one you used previously. Make a triangular selection, as highlighted in part 2, from any interesting part of the image and make the background black (or any other colour).  
Then duplicate the selection just like before.

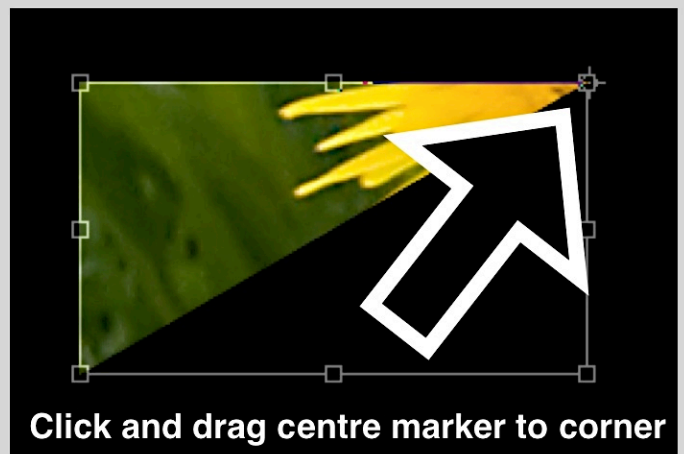


This time, from the menu bar chose **Edit - Transform - Rotate**

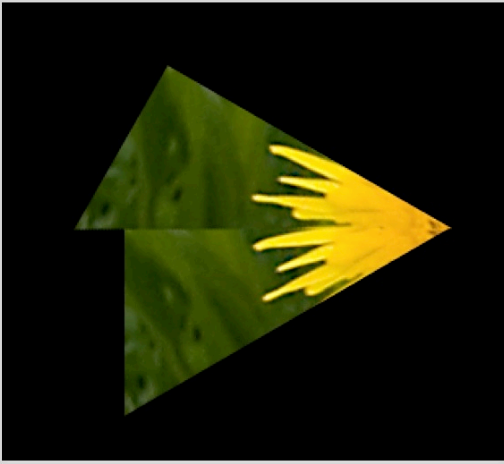


You will see a 'Bounding Box' with handles and a centre marker about which the rotation will take place.

Click on, and drag, the centre marker to the sharp point of your triangle. In this case, the top right hand side.

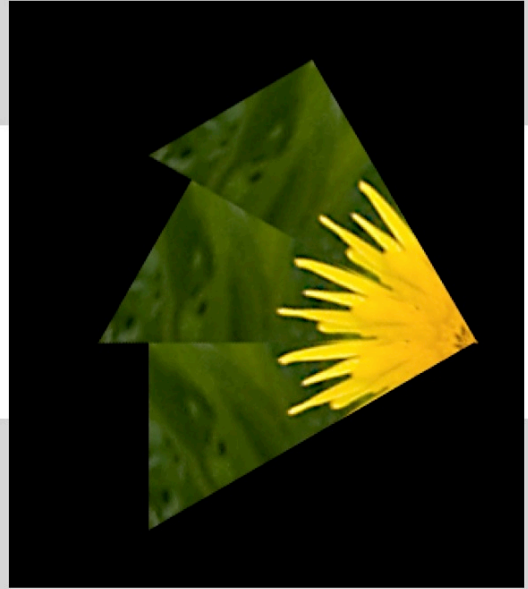


**Click and drag centre marker to corner**



Now rotate until the edges of both layers are in line. But you could leave a gap if you wished

Duplicate the layer and repeat the rotation process as before



Keep repeating the process until you have a semi circle. Then select & **'Merge the Layers'**.

Finally, duplicate the merged layers and then:

**Edit - Transform - Flip Horizontally.**

**Edit - Transform - Flip Vertically.**

Move the two layers into position to form a round pattern
