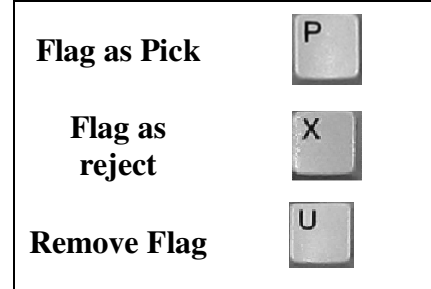


## Flagging your photos

By far the easiest way to add flags to your photos as you browse through them in Lightroom's Library is to use short cut keys...

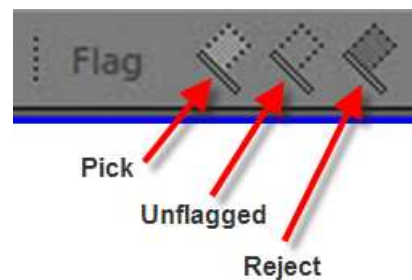


## Filtering by Flags

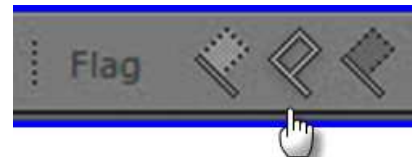
When you click on any flag in the filter mode, it will be turned on.

A second click on the flag turns it off.

In this screen shot, all flags are off.



Picks selected



Unflagged photos selected



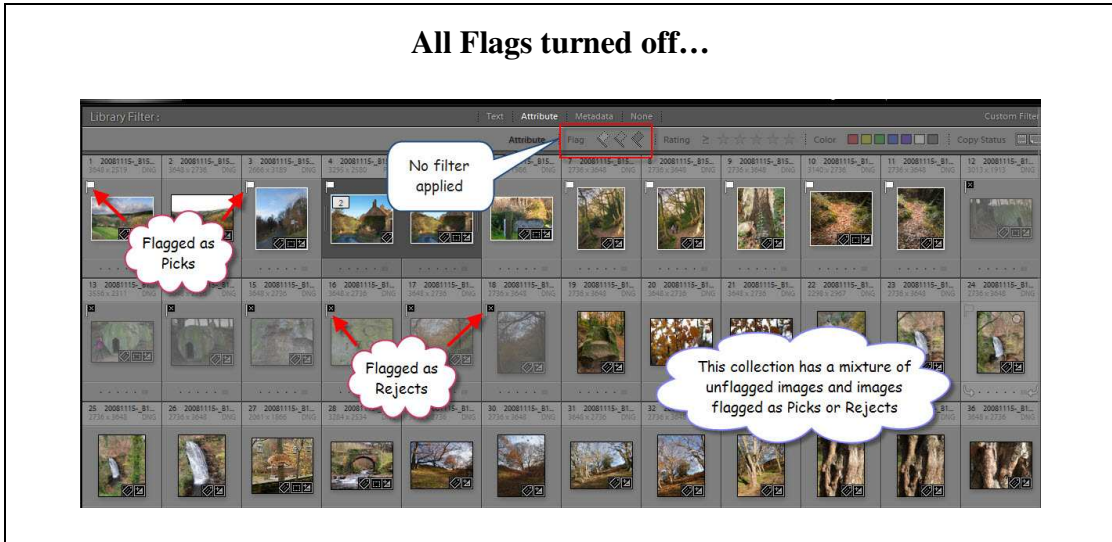
Rejects selected

**It's important to remember that you may have more than one flag on at a time. It pays to keep a close eye on those icons!**

## Photoshop Lightroom – filtering images using flags

The following examples illustrate a number of possible combinations of Flag Filters as applied to a small collection of images.

### All Flags turned off...

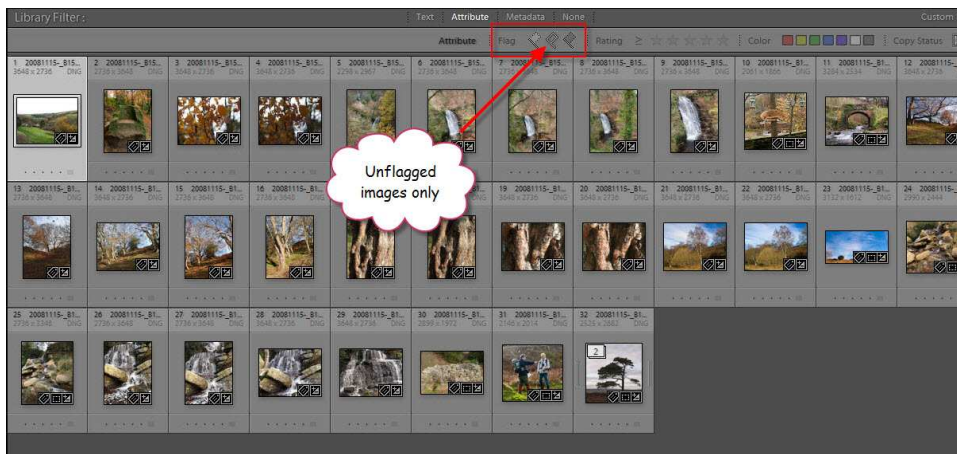


### Picks Flag on...

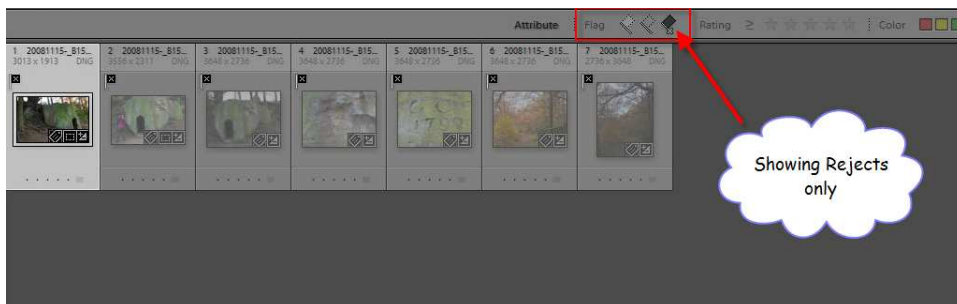


## Photoshop Lightroom – filtering images using flags

Here only the Unflagged-image Flag is turned on...



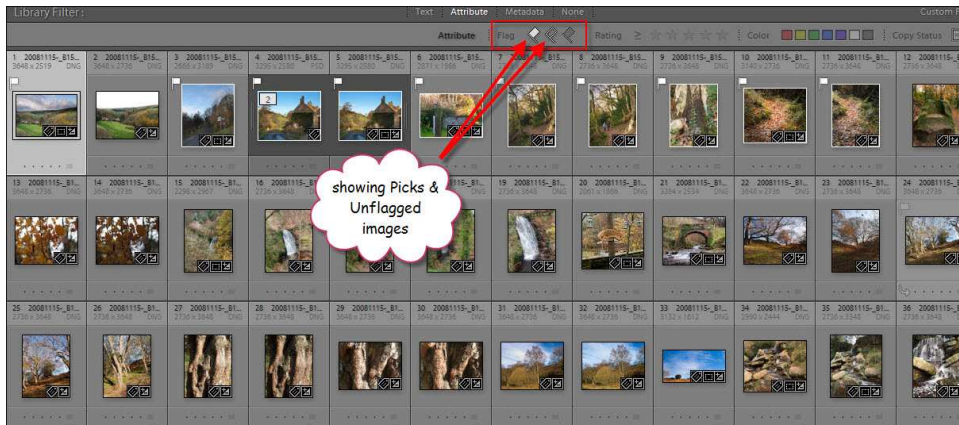
Only the rejects are shown here...



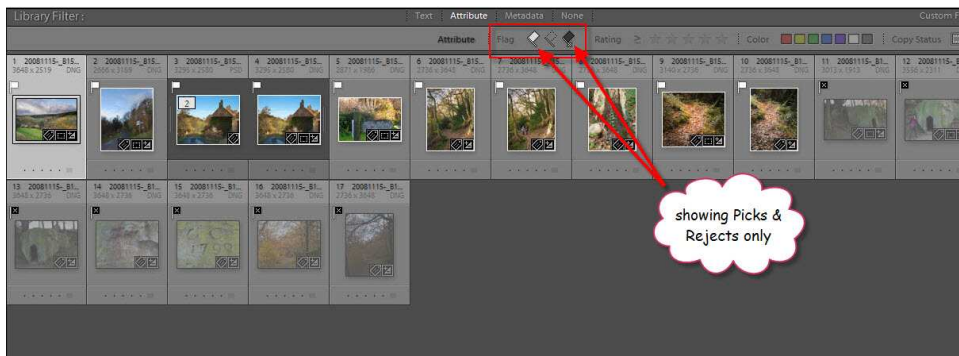
# Photoshop Lightroom – filtering images using flags

The following screen shots show situations where more than one flag is on.

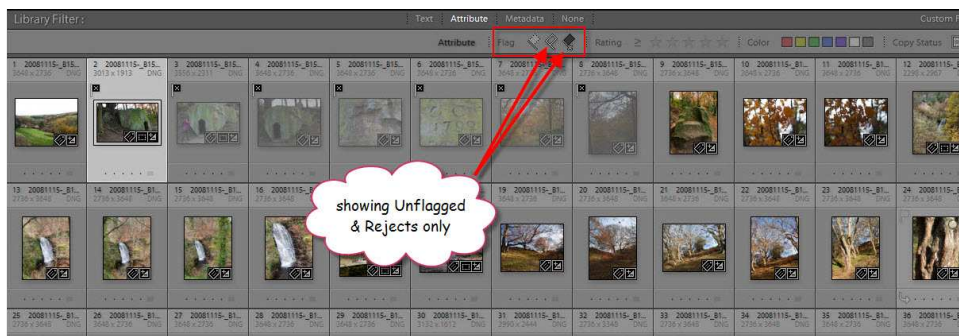
## Pick & Unflagged Flags are both turned on

## Unflagged & Reject Flags are both turned on



## Customise thumbnail display

It is possible to customise the information displayed on the thumbnail “slide mount”.



To change the items that are displayed, choose: View > View Options from the menu, or simply right-click on any slide in the library Grid view.
